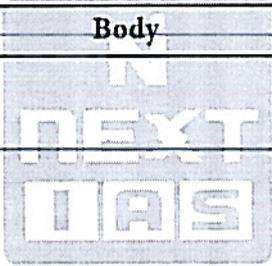

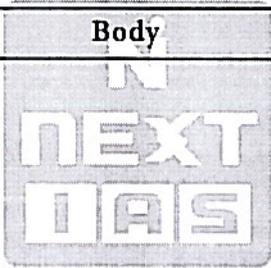

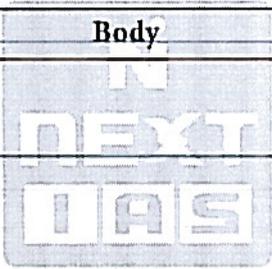

The Constituent Assembly comprised of 291 members out of which 15 were women who are referred as Founding Mothers of Indian Constitution

### Contributions of founding mothers

① Hansa Mehta: She raised voice for substantive equality and gender equality.

↳ Also made UNDRH gender neutral — replacing 'men' with 'persons'

② Dakshini Velludhan: Highlighted the intersectional vulnerabilities

③ Sarojini Naidu: She fought for universal adult suffrage w/o any property conditions

↳ Outcome is Article 325 and 326.

④ Rajkumari Amrit Kaur: She fought

for abolition of sati, untouchability, widow remarriage.

- ⑤ Begum Aizaz Rasul raised voice of women minorities.
- ⑥ Vijay Lakshmi Pandit emphasized on women participation in foreign affairs.
- ⑦ Renuka Ray advocated for uniform civil code and personal law reforms

Feminist perspective shaping Constitution's ethos

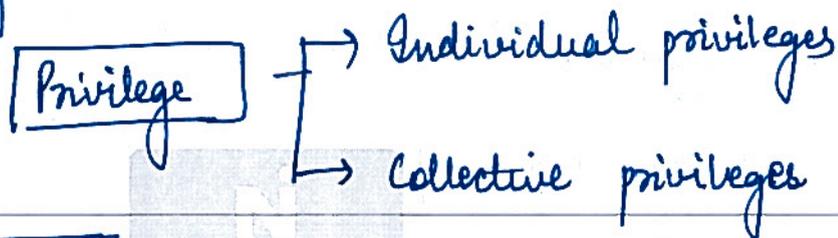
- ① Positive discrimination - Article 15(3), 15(4), 16(4), 16(6)
- ② Article 243D : 33% reservation in Panchayats.
- ③ Untouchability Offences Act, Hindu Marriage Act 1955.

Therefore the contribution of founding mothers was immense for women upliftment and it continues to evolve - 108th CAA is an evidence of it

What is a Privilege Motion in the Indian Parliament? How does the Committee of Privileges examine and deal with such motions? (Answer in 150 words) 10 Marks

Privileges have granted to MPs and members of state legislative Assemblies under Article 105 and Article 194 respectively.



Privilege Motion: It is passed when there is either breach of individual privileges or that collective privileges in the form of breach of conduct or contempt of house.

Process of dealing with Privilege Motion

- ① Members in Lok Sabha - 15 & in Privilege committee  
Rajya Sabha it is 10.
- ② A motion is referred - it is the discretion of speaker or

Chairman to accept it or reject it.

③ Once accepted, the motion can either be taken by house directly or it can be referred to Privilege Committee.

④ The charges framed are discussed - the respective member, <sup>or non-member</sup> is summoned, given opportunity to present ~~the~~ his/her justification under principle of natural justice.

⑤ If found guilty, report framed by committee shall be sent back to house.

⑥ Report may be accepted, rejected or amended.

⑦ Member or non-member may be given punishment in the form of suspension or expulsion & censure or imprisonment.

Hence Privilege motion and Privilege committee aims to <sup>maintain</sup> ~~keep~~ the conduct in appropriate manner strengthening democracy.

of successful democracies.

Role of leader of opposition (LOO)

① Ensures accountability

leader of opposition holds the government accountable through various mechanisms

eg: Question Hour, Zero Hour, etc

in Parliamentary Committees - Public Account Committee

② Checks and balances through use of Censure motion, No-confidence motion.

⑤ Role in appointment of various important officials.

Eg: ED, CBI director, ECI.

④ ~~It~~ Leader of opposition is like a Shadow Prime Minister

⑤ Office of leader of opposition provides an official means of dissent.

⑥ PM also takes advices of LoO in certain crisis situation.

⑦ Debates and discussion held on the floor of the house → strengthen democracy. Eg: Quota in lateral entry.

### Measures to enhance effectiveness

① Appointment in due time must be ensured.

② Referral of bills to the committee and regular meeting of financial committees.

③ Speaker's discretion to allow debates and discussion can be reduced.

Leader of opposition is an important position that brings out the true essence of democracy.

Judicial pronouncements shaping the balance

① TMA Pai vs. State of Karnataka case

↳ Right of minorities to establish minority educational institution.

② Frank Anthony Case :

- ↳ Right to administer the institution ~~is~~ has wide meaning - appoint teachers, have curriculum etc.
- ↳ Institutions aided by the State are subject to regulations of state.

③ St. Stephens Case :

- ↳ Minority institutions can reserve upto 50% for the minorities.

④ DAV college vs. State of Punjab Case :

- ↳ Right to administer must not mean right to maladminister.

⑤ P.A. Shanmudar case : Reservation to

OBCs, SC, ST can be imposed on minority institutions

⑥ Madarasa case : Court said that the institutions must have minimum standard of education.

Thus judiciary has time and again intervened to keep a balance between Article 14 & Article 29 & Article 30.

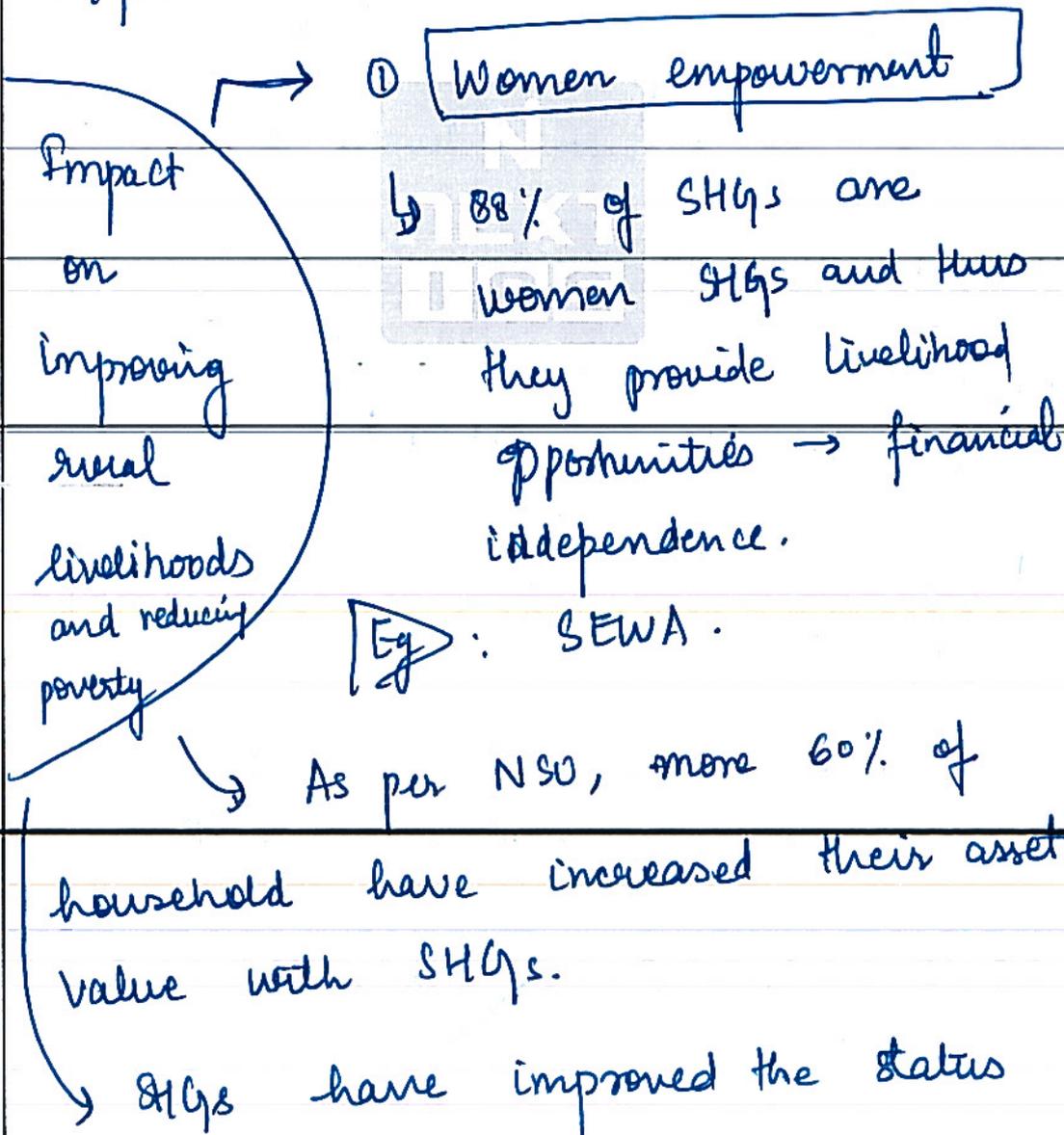

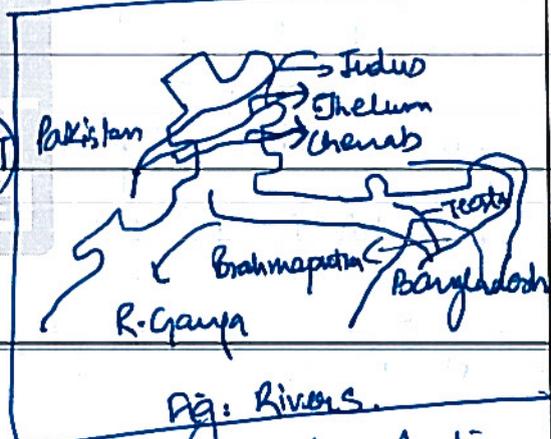

⑥ Three level mechanism ~~is~~ not followed



by Pakistan step by step.

③ Bangladesh : We share 54 small and large rivers.

① Ganga Water Treaty is set to expire in 2026. → Renewal required as per changing needs.

② Teesta water diversion ~~required~~ demand raised by Bangladesh → West Bengal government reluctant to share more water.

③ Desilting of Teesta → China's engagement with Bangladesh for mechanical dredging and building engagements.

Solutions : ① Dialogue and diplomacy to tackle challenges

↳ ② Pragmatic approach to address needs of both.

The Governor is the head of the State Executive and exercises the authority with the aid and advice of Council of Ministers except in the situation of discretion.

Recently, it has been observed that in opposition-ruled states - there has been flashpoint in the relations.

Gubernatorial overreach challenging the position of state govt.

① Jamil Wadu Governor (2024) kept the bills of state government pending for long time - affecting the functioning.

↳ Also, Governor R.N. Ravi walked out

of the house before the presentation of budget.

② Multiple passing of ordinances to bypass the state legislature as in Bihar

③ Maharashtra Governor (2021). Delay in appointment of 12 nominated members of state legislative councils.

④ Punjab Governor (2023) also kept the bills pending for long.

⑤ Kerala Governor and government tussle over appointment of Vice Chancellor of Universities.

↳ the appointment of VC was also a point of contention in Tamil Nadu.

⑥ Rescuing a bill for President even after ~~sent~~ sending the bill for re-consideration → Hurts state autonomy

⑦ Changes made in the speeches during the first session of the year.

## Safeguards to limit these acts

- ① In line with recommendation of Sarkaria and Punchi Commission → CM must be consulted in appointment of Governor.
- ② Governor must be a neutral head with no association with any political party.
- ③ SC guidelines for limiting the time for acting on bills must be followed in letter and spirit (Recent TN Governor case)
- ④ Governor should be bound by the advice of council of Ministers like the President.
- ⑤ Governor to act as a bridge between Centre and states instead of favouring centre.

Governor's office is inevitable for cooperative federalism. Powers must be restrained to have cordial relations between state and Centre.



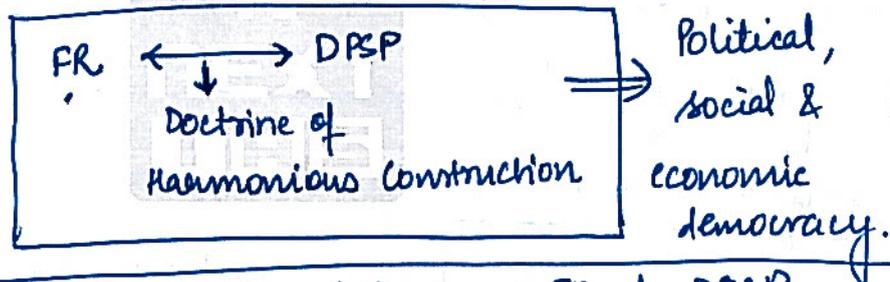

Article 14-32 and Article 37-51 deals with Fundamental Rights and DPSP respectively. As rightly said by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar FR & DPSP are the philosophy and conscience of the Constitution.



Evolving relationship between FR & DPSP

① Judicial interventions

SC → Supreme court

① Shankari Prasad Case, 1951 → SC argued

that government can take away rights to fulfill the aim of welfare state enshrined in Article 39(b) & 39(c).

② Mineo Mills Case, 1980 : The bedrock of Indian Constitution lies in the

harmonious balance between FR and DPSP.

↳ Article 14, 21 can be taken away to fulfill Article 39(b) and 39(c).

③ **Keshwanand Bharti Case, 1973**: Changes in constitution can be made provided it does not violate the basic structure doctrine.

④ **M.H. Hoskot vs State of Maharashtra Case**: Balancing Article 39(a) and Article 21 → Right to legal assistance is part of Right to life.

⑤ **Shayra Bano Case**: Ban on instant triple talaq to fulfill article 44 and article 14.

⑥ **Jankit Abhiyan Case<sup>(2023)</sup>, Indra Sawhney Case(1992), M. Nagaraj Case (2002)**  
Upholding of reservation to fulfill Article 14, 15(4), 15(6), 16(4), 16(6) → FRs and DPSP - Article 46.

⑦ **MC. Mehta Case 1988**: Right to healthy environment - Article 21 & Article 48

⑧ **Pratya Association vs State of Maharashtra Case**  
2024 - Article 14 and Article 39(b) balanced.

## ⑧ Constitutional Amendments

- ① 94th Constitutional Amendment Act, 2011 :  
Formation of cooperatives - Article 43(B) and Article 19(1)(c).

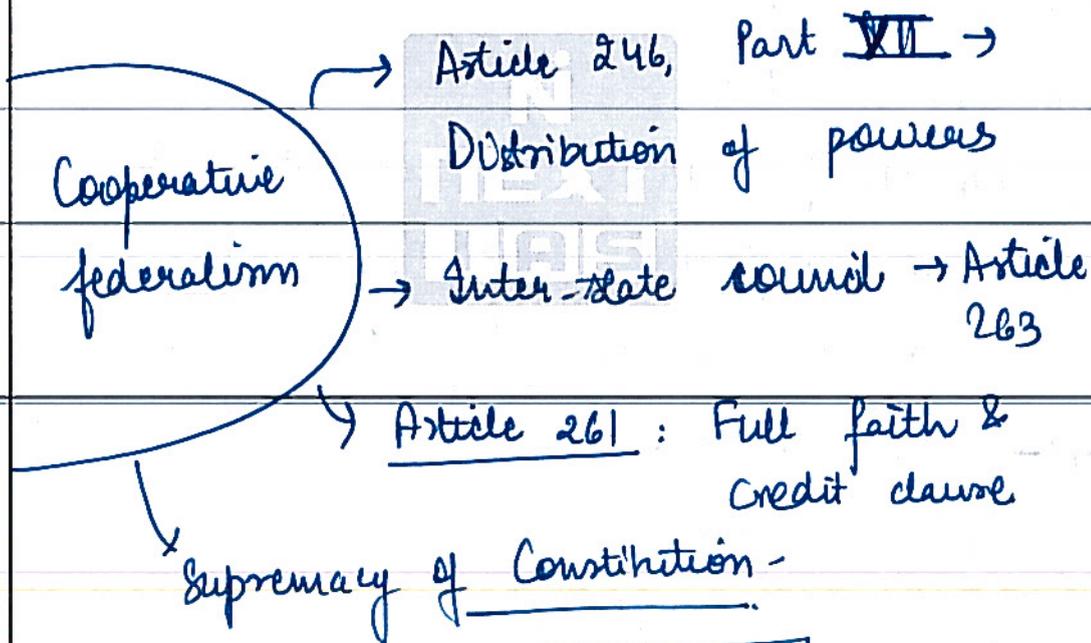

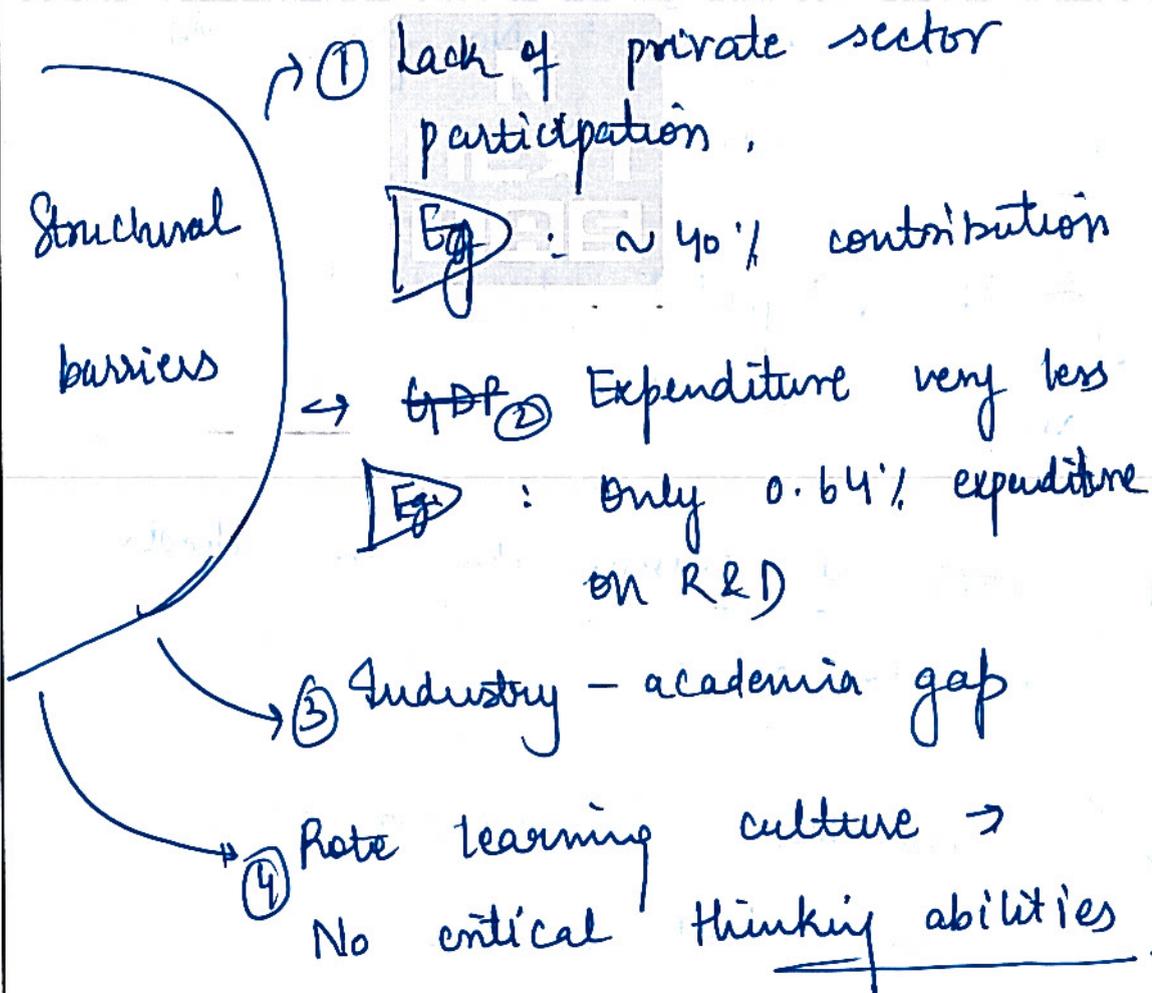

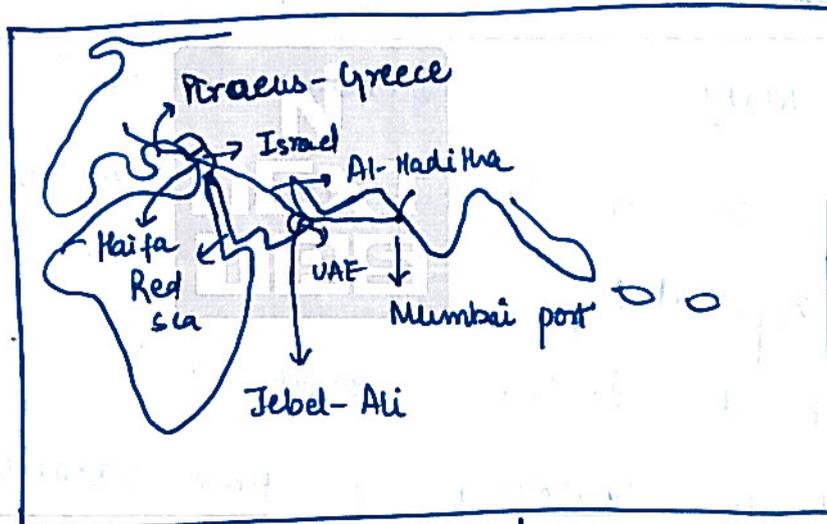
